The key to audit preparedness is developing a daily process for complying with the UR Standards of Medicare's Conditions of Participation (CoPs). This session will provide you insight into building and optimizing your UR Committee and process, ensuring an effective observation status and 1-day stay certification and appeal process that leverages case management, medical staff, and physician advisement expertise, and defending against Recovery Audit Contractor (RAC) medical necessity denials and potential False Claims Act (FCA) exposures. It will examine how to create a UR process that proactively defends against RAC medical necessity denials. Attendees will gain an in-depth understanding of the rules for RACs, and the Administrative Law Judge appeal process.
